This project consists of the rehabilitation of approximately 2,161 LF of 6-inch existing gravity sewer line, 18,137 LF of 8-inch existing gravity sewer line, 374 LF of 10-inch gravity sewer line, 892 LF of 12-inch gravity sewer line, 699 LF of 15-inch gravity sewer line and rehabilitation/replacement of approximately 113 manholes. The rehabilitation will include the replacement and reconnection of approximately 422 sewer connections and 14,770 LF of 4-inch sewer laterals.

A Pre-Bid Conference was held on August 1, 2023, and is included in Addenda. Bidders are responsible for ensuring receipt of their bid by the stated date and time. Bidders are responsible for the review of any addenda for the project and shall acknowledge the addenda on the bid form.

Each bid shall be accompanied with a cash deposit or certified check drawn on a bank or trust company insured by the FDIC or a Bid Bond prepared on the form Bid Bond contained in the Bidding Documents or a Surety Company's standard form and property executed by a corporate surety licensed under the laws of North Carolina to execute such bonds. The amount of bid bond shall be equal to five (5) percent of the total of the bid.

The Owner reserves the right to award a contract to the lowest, responsive, responsible bidder or bidders, taking into consideration quality, performance, and time.

This project will be funded by a Clean Water State Revolving Fund (CWSRF) loan of \$3,120,000.
